

Who is the course for?

Our Level 3 Dental Nurse Apprenticeship is an excellent opportunity to gain the skills, knowledge, and qualifications needed to build a successful career in Dental Nursing. With a mix of hands-on training and online learning, this programme equips learners with the expertise to provide exceptional patient care while earning a salary.

Course duration:

15 months plus EPA.

At Level 3, there are various topics that apprentices will learn including:

- Output Dental Procedures Assist Dentists with treatments ranging from routine checkups to advanced specialist procedures
- (v) Patient Care Provide high-quality support to patients, ensuring their comfort and well-being
- Infection Control Set up and decontaminate, sterilise instruments, and maintain infection control procedures in the clinical environment
- (v) Equipment Handling Prepare instruments and materials for treatments and ensure all equipment is maintained
- (Record Management Update and manage patient records accurately and securely
- (Policy Adherence Follow practice policies, procedures, and health and safety guidelines

End Point Assessment

In order to achieve the Dental Nurse Apprenticeship, learners will be required to complete a final 60-minute clinical observation to confirm safety and competence. This, along with the passing of two knowledge tests and portfolio of evidence will be sent to the awarding body to complete the End-Point Assessment (EPA) process.

Apprenticeship in Dental Nursing

The Dental Nursing Apprenticeship is a government-funded course accredited by City & Guilds. This programme follows a blended learning approach, combining online study with practical experience, and is delivered through an e-learning portfolio.

- Practical Training Gain hands-on experience in a dental practice, supported by the practice team
- Theoretical Training Complete the theory element of the programme online with guidance from Skills4Dental
- Off-the-Job Learning Participate in 4 hour bi-weekly dedicated training sessions during paid working hours to enhance your knowledge and skills
- **Duration** The knowledge delivery of this Dental Nurse Apprenticeship typically takes 15 months. The final 60-minute clinical observation, along with the passing of two knowledge tests and portfolio of evidence will be sent to the awarding organisation to complete the End-Point Assessment (EPA) process
- Knowledge Test Learners to achieve two 45-minute online multiple-choice assessments to check their knowledge whilst on programme
- Clinical observations confirming competency in the workplace undertaken by experienced assessors, reducing Clinician time away from chairside duties

What are the Entry Requirements?

To enrol onto this course, English and Maths requirements differ depending on the learner's ade:

For learners aged 16-18: It is mandatory to either already hold, or be able to work towards and achieve, the required English and Maths qualifications as part of the apprenticeship. These must be completed prior to gateway.

For learners aged 19 and over: It is recommended that applicants hold GCSE English and Maths at Grade C/4 or above (or an equivalent gualification). If evidence of prior achievement is not available at enrolment, learners may choose to complete these subjects separately through Skills4, with full funding and support provided.

While English and Maths are optional for adult learners to enrol onto this apprenticeship, completing them is strongly advised – particularly for those intending to progress to a higher-level qualification in the future.

Off-the-job Training

What is off-the-job training?

Off-the-job training is a statutory requirement for an Apprenticeship in England. It is training which is received by the apprentice within their practical period, during the apprentice's normal working hours, for the purpose of achieving the knowledge, skills and behaviours of the approved apprenticeship that is referenced in the apprenticeship agreement. By normal working hours, we mean the hours for which the apprentice would normally be paid, excluding overtime.



Why during working hours?

An apprenticeship is a work-based programme. Therefore, it is reasonable that the training must be delivered during the apprentice's normal working hours, away from their productive job role. It would be unfair to expect an apprentice to undertake the apprenticeship in their own time, in addition to their (potentially full-time) job role.

If the required off-the-job training must, by exception, take place outside of the apprentice's normal working hours (e.g. in an evening or at the weekend, for an apprentice that normally works Mon-Fri 9-5), the apprentice must agree to this and be compensated for this time (e.g. through time off in lieu (TOIL) or by being paid for these hours). The majority of the programme must not be delivered in this way.
